


Mr. Ron Hatcher-

Class of 1956: Ron, was a three sport star at Airport during the mid-1950's,

excelling in football, basketball and baseball for the Jets. Ron was an honorable mention *all-state* basketball selection in 1954-55, the same season he led the county in scoring, averaging 18.3 points per game. Ron made the varsity football team as a freshman and won most improved honors during his four years on the gridiron. A team captain in both football and basketball, he led his team in scoring and rebounding while setting school records at the time for free throws made in a season (92), field goals made in a season (119), points in a season (330), and career points (697). Was the 1955-56 Most Valuable Player award recipient in basketball. He was also a member of Airport's *first ever* District Championship basketball team in 1954.


Mr. Robert Auten-

Class of 1962: Bob Auten, an Airport Baseball great, received 4 varsity letters from 1959-1962. During that span Bob had an 18 strike out effort (7-inning game), while taking home team MVP honors in both 1961 and 1962. He signed with the Minnesota Twins in 1962. Following his baseball career Bob enjoyed an outstanding career in slow pitch softball, 4-times being named an All-American and a 1984 inductee into the "ASA" Hall of Fame.

Mr. Auten is retired from Ford Motor Company.

Randy Anteau Athlete




Mr. Randy Anteau-

Class of 1967:

Randy was a two sport star at Airport, being named All-State in both football and basketball as a senior. On the gridiron, Randy was a 6'5 split end who was the Jets main pass catching threat. He also played linebacker under head coach Lloyd Lamphere. Randy is remembered most for his play on the hardwood. He was second in the county in scoring despite averaging 25.1 points per contest during the 1966-67 season. That same season he led the Jets to a share of the Huron League Championship while setting the single season record for points scored with 548. A record that still stands today. After leaving Airport, Randy played three seasons of basketball at the University of Detroit under legendary coach Bob Calihan and along side soon-to-be NBA Hall-of-Famer, Spencer Haywood.




Barb Munch-Kohn Coach

Barbara Munch-Kohn- Coach Kohn, a graduate of Bowling Green State University began teaching at Airport In 1970. Mrs. Kohn coached multiple sports as the director of the GAA (Girls Athletic Association) at Airport prior to leading the varsity programs in cheerleading, basketball, cross country, track and volleyball. Not only did Barb coach these teams, she started a number of programs during

their infancy as varsity sports. Barb coached girls track for 20 years, winning 5 Huron League Championships, 3 regional Titles and had a number of individual regional champions as well as 8 top-10 state award winners during that span. She was the Airport Girls Cross Country Coach for over 30 years. For 12 of the 30(+) years she served as coach of both the boys and girls teams. Barb's girls teams won 5 Huron League titles, 1-Regional Championship and one unofficial State Team Champion. She coached a number of regional and state champions during her time as the girls coach. As the boys Cross Country Coach, Mrs. Kohn led 5 Huron League Championship teams while providing direction to a handful of League, Regional individual champions as well as a 5th place finisher at the state meet. Despite her glowing success as a cross country and track coach, she may have done her best work as head volleyball coach. Barb coached the Jet Volleyball team for over 25 seasons, helping 12 of her teams win Huron League and District Championships, 7 Regional Titles, 4 appearances in the State Final-Four and 1 State Runner-up in 2004. During her time as head volleyball coach, she had numerous athletes selected as All-State performers, as well as a number of individual and team All-State Academic award winners. Coach Kohn is a member of the MIVCA Hall of Fame.

Mr. Jim Kohn-

Coach Kohn, a graduate of Central Michigan University began teaching at Airport in 1969. Prior to his retirement from teaching in 2001, Jim served as both an assistant on Airport's football staff under both Lloyd Beardsley (1969-74) and Eric Redmond (1996) and head baseball coach from 1987 to 2001. During that stretch, he led the Airport Baseball program to 8 Huron League Championships, 5 District Championships, 2 Regional titles and a 1993 State Finals appearance. Coach Kohn spends his summers as an assistant coach on one of the state's best summer baseball programs, the Blissfield American Legion team, Post 325. Coach Kohn is a member of the Michigan High School Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame.
