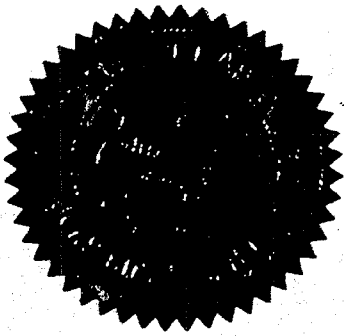

Before the examination of the witnesses begins, it should first be ascertained that they are citizens, and that they each have the required knowledge of the petitioner's residence, after which they should each be duly sworn to testify as to the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth, in the matter of the said petition.

After the depositions of the witnesses are taken and reduced to writing, the same should be carefully read to the respective witnesses, and when a witness has assented to the truth of his respective answers as recorded, he will then sign his name at the bottom of his own deposition and swear to the truth of the same before the commissioner or notary. This oath is in addition to the preliminary oath which is administered previous to the commencement of his examination.
